### **Course Description:**

This Special Event Seminar is built around the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist convention and team-taught by the Theological/Historical Studies division and the Christian Education division. The seminar is held on a yearly basis on-site at the conference location and engages the student in a study of the theology and polity of Southern Baptist as expressed at an annual meeting of the Southern Baptist convention. Students will attend the various sessions of the convention and discuss numbers issues in a small group setting. Emphasis will be placed on persons, events, ideas, and movements in Southern Baptist life as well as on doctrines distinctive to Southern Baptists. In addition to attending the convention sessions, students will complete designated course requirements.

### **Course Goals:**

The student who satisfactorily completes this seminar by fulfillment of the requirements should be able to:

1. Recall and write basic factual information about selected persons, events, ideas, and movements in Southern Baptist life from the assigned readings and seminar discussions;
2. Articulate and define various Baptist decisions proposed and adopted at the Southern Baptist Convention;
3. Comprehend and interpret contemporary issues in Southern Baptist life as represented at the Southern Baptist Convention;
4. Identify and evaluate the theological doctrines and distinctives which Southern Baptists have and do believe;
5. Integrate critically and effectively decisions and doctrines of the Southern Baptist Convention in preaching, evangelizing, counseling, and various other ministry endeavors; and
6. Dialogue with various convention personnel.

### **Seminar Expectations:**

The 2009 Annual Meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention will be held at the **Kentucky Exposition Center, Louisville, KY, June 22-24, 2009**. For information about registration, hotels, etc., visit the website <http://www.sbc.net>.

The Southern Baptist Convention at Work is an "on location" professional doctoral seminar. **The event itself is the classroom.** Students are therefore required to attend and participate in the SBC in its entirety. Please read carefully the SBC meetings and Seminar Sessions required. If you bring your spouse and/or family to the Convention, please be aware that there will be limited family time because of

scheduled meetings and sessions. Seminar participants are expected to come to the SBC with assigned work completed and ready to submit to the appropriate professor at the designated time. In addition, students are to submit all post-seminar assignments in accordance with seminar deadlines.

### Pre-Seminar Assignment:

**Textbook Readings and Reading Response:** Seminar participants will read the three required textbooks prior to the seminar. Each student will provide a reading response report (3-5 typed pages, single-spaced) for **each** textbook. The response will include significant contributions, strengths, weaknesses, applications and implications for denominational issues, etc. .

### Seminar Assignments:

**Peer-Led Discussions:** Students will lead discussions from the assigned textbooks or portions of the textbooks. Discussions should reflect: (1) an understanding of the issues and principles discussed; and (2) an application of the issues and principles discovered to ministry within the context of a Southern Baptist church and/or the Southern Baptist Convention. Discussions should demonstrate theological reflection ("what is it?") and ministerial integration ("so what?" or "what difference does this make?").

**SBC Committee Meetings and Press Conference:** All students **must attend** the following three meetings: **The SBC Executive Committee Plenary Session (Monday, June 22, time TBA); the Resolutions Committee Meeting (Tuesday, June 23, time TBA); and the Presidential Press Conference (Tuesday, June 23, time TBA).** As soon as arrangements are finalized, then an email will be sent announcing the times of these meetings. Traditionally, the SBC Executive Committee meeting is on Monday afternoon. Students should plan to arrive at the SBC location no later than noon on Monday. Students must attend all of these meetings. In addition, students must attend all Business Sessions of the SBC.

**Seminar Sessions:** In addition to the SBC meetings, students will attend and participate in two on-location **Seminar Sessions**. The first session will meet **Monday afternoon following the SBC Executive Committee Plenary Session (June 22), ending no later than 6:00 p.m., and the second session will meet on Wednesday afternoon (June 24), ending no later than 6:00 p.m.** Location will be announced when arrangements have been made. All students are required to be in attendance for the entirety of each session; **no exceptions**.

### Post-Seminar Assignments:

**Summary and Reports:** Seminar participants will complete and submit the following summaries and reports. The writing style is to be single-spaced, double-spacing between paragraphs, with no indention at the start of a paragraph, using one-inch margins. Times New Roman font (12 point) is preferred. Only the left margin should be justified. A cover page should accompany each report, as per Turabian, with no intervening blank page between the cover page and the summary or report.

1. **Summary of the Proceedings of the Southern Baptist Convention.** 5 pages. The summary must include major decisions, issues, and reports presented. As a part of this assignment, make a verbal presentation in either a regular church service (Sunday a.m. or p.m. or Wed. p.m.) or to a significant ministry group in the church (Church Council, Staff meeting, Deacons meeting, etc.). Submit a summary of the meeting and subsequent responses.
2. **Report on the Presidential Press Conference.** 3 pages. The report must include a summary of the content, major issues raised/addressed, significant questions from the press, and your personal reaction to the event.

3. **Report on the Resolutions Committee Meeting.** 3 pages. The report must include a summary of the meeting, the committee procedures, and your personal reaction to the Resolutions process. As an Addendum to the report, attach a list of the Resolutions Committee members and a copy of the final draft of the resolutions adopted by the Convention.

**Reflection Paper:** Students will write a Reflection Paper which integrates their experience and assessment of the Southern Baptist Convention. The project will evaluate the challenges and opportunities which the Southern Baptist Convention will face in the future. Students will also make recommendations on how they believe the Southern Baptist Convention could best meet these challenges and take advantage of the opportunities. The Reflection Paper may also address any significant decisions, trends, and/or emerging issues which will impact the future of the SBC. The length of the reflection project will be 12-15 pages, double-spaced, and adhere to the form and style guidelines of Kate L. Turabian, 6th edition.
