Course Description

This course is designed to give the musical worship leader a basic knowledge of the fundamentals of music, with an emphasis on the kinds of music currently used in worship gatherings. Attention will be given to note reading, chord structure, chord symbol recognition, etc. There are no prerequisites for this course.

Objectives

1. To develop a basic understanding of how music is structured.

- 2. To develop the skill of note reading.
- 3. To develop a basic understanding of intervals, scales, and chords.
- 4. To develop the ability to read modern chord symbols with understanding.
- 5. To develop a basic understanding of arranging.

Course Methodology

1. Weekly guided assignments in Blackboard throughout the semester.

2. Online exercises and drills.

Course Requirements

1. Satisfactory completion of weekly assignments (learning modules) with individual student progress reports turned in.

2. Satisfactory completion of sectional quizzes (refer to course calendar).

3. Satisfactory completion of a hymn arrangement (melody and chord symbols) according to the guidelines provided by the instructor during the course.

4. Satisfactory completion of the final exam.
