Purpose of the course

The purpose of this course is to provide for the students quality theological education in the discipline of Christian Education Studies.

Course Description

This course is designed to provide the student with a foundational understanding of Christian Education Ministry as it relates to preschoolers, children, youth and adults in the local church. Consideration is given to the issues of faith development, age-graded learning characteristics, and Southern Baptist programming.

Textbooks

There is one required textbook for the course.

There are also five optional textbooks for this course. They are from the Teaching for Spiritual Transformation Series. These provide detailed materials about each age group.

Student Objectives

- 1. Students will demonstrate a foundational understanding of Christian Education, faith development, and age-graded learning characteristics.
- 2. Students will exhibit the development of personal perspectives related to spiritual education.
- 3. Students will demonstrate ability to evaluate, design and implement appropriate Christian Education principles.

Course Requirements

<u>Reading.</u> Students are expected to read the textbooks. An accountability question will be on the final exam.

Observation Reports. Students are to observe four Christian education experiences in the local church setting. The four sessions should be with four different age groups (i.e., preschool, children, youth, and adults). Students should then prepare a two-page written report of their observations and analysis of each session (for a total of eight pages). The Turabian style guide should be used in preparing the reports.

<u>Evaluation Project</u> Students will conduct an evaluation of a specific age group ministry for appropriate Christian Education standards. A paper containing 1,500-1,750 words will be prepared stating the findings from the evaluation and making recommendations to improve the education process. The evaluation should be based on the material that was covered in the course. The Turabian style guide should be used in preparing the reports.

Exams. Students will complete three sectional exams and a final exam.

<u>Class Participation.</u> Students are expected to participate in the discussions presented in class. Participation is expected on a weekly basis. Please see the Discussion Board for more instructions.
