

Leadership Training for Women CEWM 5163

New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary Christian Education Division Fall 2015 Online

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The mission of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary is to equip leaders to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandments through the local church and its ministries.

Purpose of the Course

The purpose of this course is to provide specialized training in leadership for women in ministry to women through the local.

Core Value Focus

Each academic year, a core value is emphasized. This academic year, the core value is *Mission Focus*. "We are not here merely to get an education or to give one. We are here to change the world by fulfilling the Great Commission and the Great Commandments through the local church and its ministries."

Curriculum Competencies Addressed

This course will address the following curriculum competencies:

- 1. Biblical Exposition: The student will explore biblical teachings about leadership.
- 2. *Christian Theological Heritage:* The student will explore theological and historical background for leading other women.
- 3. Disciple Making: The student will learn to facilitate spiritual growth in Christian women.
- 4. *Interpersonal Skills:* The student will improve interpersonal communication as well as ministry skills.
- 5. *Servant Leadership:* The student will discover how to lead others toward spiritual maturity and use of spiritual gifts.
- 6. *Spiritual and Character Formation:* The student will develop personal and spiritual maturity as she begins to lead others.
- 7. Worship Leadership: The student will increase skills for leading in the church.

Course Description

This course is designed to review specific leadership strategies which could be effectively employed in leading the women's ministry program of a local church.

Student Learning Outcomes

By the completion of this course, the student should be able to accomplish the following:

- 1. Explore her own leadership style.
- 2. Examine different styles of leading and learning.
- 3. Understand the unique challenges of leadership.
- 4. Integrate the essentials of leadership in the local church.
- 5. Implement personal leadership skills in her ministry context.

Assignments and Evaluation Criteria

Teaching Method. This course will utilize lecture and interactive discovery-learning and will be team-taught. The student should expect different presentation formats to enhance the learning motif.

Netiquette: Appropriate Online Behavior

Each student is expected to demonstrate appropriate Christian behavior when working online on Discussion Boards or whenever interaction occurs through web, digital, or other electronic medium. The student is expected to interact with other students in a fashion that will promote learning and respect for the opinions of others in the course. A spirit of Christian charity is expected at all times in the online environment.

Assignments and Evaluation Criteria

- 1. Students will attend class as stated in the graduate catalog.
- 2. Students will participate in class discussion including a separate session for graduate students.
- 3. Students will read the assigned textbooks and provide a written statement of completion which will be due four weeks from the last day of class.
- 4. Students will complete a project as described which will be due within four weeks after the last day of class.

Project

The project will include the evaluation of your own leadership style and establishment of your personal leadership goals. Evaluate yourself as a leader by considering all components of the class and the results of your leadership inventory. Develop your own mission statement as a leader then list some specific goals for your future as a leader. Also discuss how you plan to evaluate your fulfillment of these goals.

This report should be ten to fifteen pages, typed double spaced following *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses and Dissertations* by Kate Turabian, published by University of Chicago Press.

5. Students will complete a take home final examination. It will be due within four weeks after completing the last day of class.
