NOBTS MISSION STATEMENT:

- -- **Servant Leadership** The course will encourage the worship leader to appreciate how task description refinement, organizational efficiency, and enlightened perspective can strengthen ministry to fellow staff members, church musicians, and the congregation. The course will also encourage worship planners to take seriously their role as servant leaders and/or facilitators in designing corporate worship.

CORE COMPETENCIES:

- -- **Servant Leadership** Students will reflect on their role as servant leaders in facilitating worship in local congregations to both the churched and the unchurched.
- -- Interpersonal Skills Students will explore and more clearly define the role and tasks of the minister of music position, thus improving communication abilities with church staff, church musicians, the congregation, and the community.
- -- **Worship Leadership** Students will be challenged in learning to facilitate worship leadership more effectively within the local church.

DESCRIPTION:

This D.M.A. reading colloquium in contemporary trends in church music consists of discussions covering various readings in the field of current church music thought and practice. This colloquium centers on readings in the areas of controversy that every church, and especially church staff, should be aware of and have a loving, Biblical response to. The colloquium will meet approximately once a month during the semester for discussion periods. The meetings will consist of student-lead discussions of reading list articles as well as other possible selections assigned by the professor.

STUDENT OUTCOMES:

The primary outcome of this colloquium is that students grasp and begin to grapple the larger scope of current issues being addressed, or ignored, by churches. The research on these topics should been seen as an opportunity to examine the full scope of positions - pros/cons, biblical/cultural beliefs, concepts that the presenter agrees with, and disagrees with. With this converging of the music ministry fields, students should be better prepared for practicing, teaching, and researching the breadth of current church music practice.

REQUIREMENTS:

- A. All colloquium members are to read all the articles on the reading lists for the topics listed below. Each student will be prepared to lead one 20-25 minute lecture/discussion per workshop. Once the lecture is presented, leaders are expected to field questions and stimulate discussion by asking key questions about the topic. A copy of each presentation, with footnotes and bibliography, should be emailed to the professor on the Tuesday prior to each workshop. At the end of the lecture, a copy should be provided for each student.
- B. Non-presenting colloquium members are expected to prepare, respond, challenge, ask questions, and participate actively in the discussions. Failure to participate will affect one's final grade for the colloquium.
- C. Due to the compressed time frame of the colloquium, no absences, or partial absences, are allowed.
- D. Reviews are due by email to the professor no later than the Tuesday before class meets—Word or WordPerfect files only; no .pdf files please, no exceptions.
