NOBTS Core Value:

Each year one of the five core values of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary is selected by the president to receive focused attention. This year *Doctrinal Integrity* is our core value. As a beginning in Systematic Theology I we will focus our attention on thinking and speaking accurately about the basic doctrines of biblical faith.

Course Description (From NOBTS Catalog)

THEO5300 Systematic Theology 1 (3 hours) This first course in systematic theology introduces the student to the methodology of the study of theology (Prolegomena), and the doctrines of revelation, God, humanity, and the person of Christ. The biblical foundation and the relevant historical developments are considered in construction of a Christian understanding of each doctrine.

Student Learning Outcomes

The student, by the end of the course, should be able to:

- <u>Understand</u> theological method and the doctrines of revelation, God, humanity, and the person of Christ biblically, historically, and systematically.
- <u>Apply</u> theology by integrating these doctrines into a coherent, comprehensive, and consistent Christian worldview.
- *Communicate* these doctrines in the particular ministry calling and context of the learner.

Biblical Authority

The professor of this course operates under the assumption that the Bible is the inspired, totally true and trustworthy Word of God. While history, tradition and reason play no small role in the theological task, the Bible holds ultimate authority in Christian doctrine and practice. *The Baptist Faith and Message* (2000) provides the structure of this course's content.

Course Teaching Methodology

The course will involve the following methodologies:

- Lectures both live and video
- Guided discussions
- Written assignments
- Assigned reading
- Ministry task

Assignments:

<u>Guided Research Paper</u>: Each student will write a guided research paper consisting of approximately 3,000 words. Guidelines for the paper will be distributed in the week before the first class meeting. The paper is due after writing center input on Dec 3, 2018.

<u>Critical Book Review</u>: Each student will write a critical book review of a book from the optional reading list or an agreeable substitute. Guidelines for a critical review will be distributed in the week before the first class meeting. The Critical Review is due Nov 5, 2018.

<u>Quizzes</u>: From the 2nd to the 10th week quizzes will assess each student's comprehension of the two required texts, Millard Erickson's book: *Christian Theology 3rd Edition* and the on line videos and powerpoints in our BlackBoard shell. No more than 10 objective questions will compose the weekly quiz. These questions are based on the preceding week's reading and viewing assignment.

<u>Mid Term Exam</u>: The midterm exam is designed to allow the student to express the essence of the doctrinal truths covered in the first half of the semester.

<u>Final Exam</u>: The final exam is similar to the midterm and comprehensive of the semester. Students who are present and on time for all class sessions and achieve a 95% for work due and submitted before Nov 19 are exempt from the final exam.


