**Ways in Which Leavell College Students
Can Participate in the BCPP**

The Baptist College Partnership Program (BCPP) offers three ways in which students can apply specific courses taken in their undergraduate studies to apply toward graduate credit. These three methods include BCPP testing, BCPP advanced placement, and BCPP seminars. Each of these is explained below.

BCPP Testing

Following are the Leavell College courses that qualify you to test out of the course at the graduate level. Remember, an A or B is required on the undergraduate level for you to qualify to test out of the course at the graduate level.

Following are the Leavell College courses that qualify you to fulfill the graduate requirement via the Baptist College Partnership Program – in a one-week seminar format. Remember, an A or B is required on the undergraduate level for you to qualify to participate in the seminar at the graduate level.

Note: 6 hours of undergraduate studies are required to qualify for participating in the BCPP seminars. Remember, only those courses where an A or B was earned are considered for transfer into the BCPP.

⁴To qualify for the History of Christianity Seminar, you are to have completed THCM2350 (Church History 1) + THCM2351 (Church History II).

⁵To qualify for the Developmental Studies Seminar, you are to have completed any two of the courses listed in the *Development Studies Column*. The BCPP office encourages those two courses highlighted in yellow – CECM2310 (Human Development) and CECM1300 (Introduction to Christian Education) serve as the foundational courses. Therefore, the suggestion is to take one of these courses and then select one additional course from the other identified courses.
