STATEMENT ON STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness and Assessment and Accreditation oversees NOBTS' institutional research and effectiveness programs. Educational effectiveness reflects the strength and integrity of educational programs. Academic programs and administrative units establish learning outcomes / objectives, identify appropriate measures, and set achievement targets. Student and unit performance are assessed annually and the findings are used to improve programs and service offerings. NOBTS also evaluates its institution-wide performance through ongoing strategic planning processes led by the Administrative Council.

NOBTS monitors four categories as key markers for student achievement:

- Time-to-Completion
- Placement

- Licensure for Counseling Students
- Student Debt

Time-to-Completion

NOBTS annually assesses time-to-completion for its undergraduate and graduate programs annually as one mark of its educational effectiveness. For academic year 2014-2015, 69% of undergraduate completers finished their program in less than five years. Among Master's students completing their degree in the same academic year, 53% of Master's of Divinity students completed their program in under five years while 66% of students in all other Master's programs completed their degrees in less than five years. Within the area of professional doctoral studies, 65% of Doctor of Ministry students completed their program within five years, 56% of DEdMin students completed their program within six years. In the Research Doctoral program 60% of students earned their degree within six years.

Undergraduate and Master's Program Time-to-Completion

- 60% of Leavell College students typically complete their degree and graduate within 5 years.
- 60% of Master's Students typically complete their degree and graduate within 5 years.

The Registrar's Office compiled the statistics below for the amount of time it took each student to complete the degree (initial admission to graduation) was recorded. The numbers below represent the percentage of each graduating class from 2012-2015 to complete their respective degree within five years.

Professional Doctoral Program Time-to-Completion

• 60% students in the professional doctoral program typically their program within 5 years.

More specifically in recent years,

- 65% of DMin students completed the degree in 5 years.
 - \circ (3 years = 35%; 4 years = 18.5%; 5 years = 11.5%)
- 56% of DEdMin students completed the degree in 6 years.
 - \circ (4 years = 22.6%; 5 years = 22.5%; 6 years = 11%)
- Annual number of Professional Doctoral graduates per year = 40.

Research Doctoral Program Time-to-Completion

• 60% of Research Doctoral students typically complete their degree and graduate within 6 years of matriculation.

Using data collected since the December 1999 graduation, students in the research doctoral program have overwhelmingly completed their program within 7 or less years.

- 54% of students completed the program in 5.5 years or less.
- 67% of students completed the program in 6 years or less.
- 77% of students completed the program in 6.5 years or less.
- 89% of students completed the program in 7 years or less.

Placement

In its graduate programs, NOBTS also considers student placement as an indicator of effectiveness. Among self-reporting completers from the Spring 2016 graduation, 62% of graduates had found placement; 45% were pursuing another degree; and 27% were seeking placement. For Leavell College students, among self-reporting completers from the Spring 2016 graduation, 53% of graduates had found placement; 62% were pursuing another degree; and 26% were seeking placement.

• 70% of graduates from Master's programs at NOBTS and the undergraduate school at Leavell College typically find employment in a ministry context within 13 months after graduation.

Licensure of Counseling Students

NOBTS offers the Master's of Divinity Counseling/Licensure Track and the Master's of Arts in Marriage and Family Counseling to prepare students pursuing state licensure.

• 85% of Master's of Divinity Counseling/Licensure Track students and Master's of Arts in Marriage and Family Counseling students who attempt to earn their professional licensure typically succeed in doing so within the first year of their attempt.

All 68% of Alumni respondents who have attempted licensure (including interns) have achieved licensure or intern status. Only 3% reported being licensed as an LMFT, but there was not an option on the survey for a second licensure, so it is possible a higher number are dually licensed.

NOBTS Student Debt at Graduation

Finally, NOBTS has recognized the need to address student educational debt. NOBTS does not participate in the Federal Loan Program, but does certify private student educational loans. NOBTS will consider students successful if 10% of NOBTS students graduate with less than an average of \$15,000 in private student educational loan debt accrued while in seminary at NOBTS.
