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Mission Statement

New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary and Leavell College prepare servants to walk with Christ, proclaim His truth, and fulfill His mission.

Core Value Focus

The seminary has five core values: Doctrinal Integrity, Spiritual Vitality, Mission Focus, Characteristic Excellence, and Servant Leadership. <u>The core value focus for this academic year</u> <u>is Spiritual Vitality</u>: We are a worshiping community, with both personal spirituality and gathering together as a Seminary for the praise and adoration of God and instruction in His Word. The doctrinal statements used in our evaluations are our Articles of Religious Belief and the Baptist Faith and Message Statement.

Curriculum Competencies

All graduates of NOBTS are expected to have at least a minimum level of competency in each of the following areas: Biblical Exposition, Christian Theological Heritage, Disciple Making, Interpersonal Skills, Servant Leadership, Spiritual and Character Formation, and Worship Leadership. The curriculum competencies addressing in this course are: Disciple Making, Interpersonal Skills, and Servant Leadership.

Course Description

This course is designed to discuss approaches specific to reaching teen girls and young adult women, examine the biblical teachings about the responsibility of older women teaching younger women, and develop strategies for outreach and discipleship of women in emerging generations.

Student Learning Outcomes

By the completion of the course, each student will be able to:

- 1. Understand the importance of ministry to young women as discussed in class.
- 2. Identify the spiritual, physical, mental, emotional, and relational needs of postmodern young women to be met through the local church as a result of class discussion.
- 3. Study biblical teachings about leadership for ministry to young women from reading the textbooks and Scripture.
- 4. Develop a ministry plan to meet the unique needs of teen girls and young adult women in the local church through completion of the ministry plan.

Course Requirements

- 1. Attend class. This course is in the workshop format. Seminary policy states that a student may not miss any class due to the short length of the workshop. Review the syllabus, required reading, and course outline and download materials as needed.
- 2. **Participate in class discussion**. Participation is determined by online class meetings as well as by posts and responses in the Threaded Discussions. These discussions will be related to the material covered in the course content. All students are required to post a minimum of three responses in the main discussion thread: one in answer to the presenting questions, and two in response to classmates' posts.
- 3. **Read assigned textbooks and other reading assignments**. Reading assignments will include readings from the textbooks, Scripture, and other sources. Provide a written statement of completion of all reading assignments, **due Friday**, **June 26**, **2020**.

4. Create an Emerging Generations Ministry Plan.

Each student will develop a year-long ministry plan for teen girls or young adult women based in a local church. This plan should reflect content from the textbooks, sources from the annotated bibliography, discussions from class, and one's own ideas about planning for young women. The plan should include the following elements:

- 1. Summary of ministry philosophy to young women (2-3 pages)
 - a. Rationale for ministry to young women
 - b. Needs unique to this age group
 - c. Differences in ministry to this age group v. other age groups of women
- 2. Biblical foundations of ministry to young women (1 page)
- 3. Leadership Development for the ministry (1 page)
- 4. Explanation of ministries needed for this age group (2-3 pages)
 - a. Develop a proposed ministry calendar for one year (to include organization and implementation of mentoring/discipleship groups as well as special events)
 - * Name each event, purpose of event (with particular attention to what need it will address), description of theme, and brief overview of planning process

- * Name mentoring/discipleship group(s), purpose of group (with particular attention to what need it will address), target age of group, how long group will meet, what group will study
- * While planning this calendar, consider placement in total ministry plan for church
- 5. Evaluation of the Ministry (1/2 page)

The project report should be 6-8 pages, typed and double-spaced, **due Friday June 12, 2020.**

5. Students will research a current issue facing teen girls or young adult women and write a research paper about a social issue facing teenage girls. The research should include information concerning the issue, why the issue is relevant to teen girls or young adult women, and how the church can respond with ministry to young women. The paper should be 8-10 pages of content, typed and double-spaced following the guidelines of the most recent edition of *Turabian* with the proper NOBTS cover page. See the guide included in this syllabus for further instructions. This assignment is due Friday, June 26, 2020.
