COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to give students an overview of recent trends in current and emerging technology as related to church music and worship applications. Areas of investigation can include computer software programs dealing with musical notation, sequencing, and recording, as well as multimedia presentation and church music administration software. Additionally, students will research the technology and maintenance of sound systems, sound system components, lighting, video projection systems, and traditional keyboard instruments. Architecture and acoustics are also addressed in this class.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. The student will acquire knowledge of available music software, video presentation software, and technology used in the church.
2. The student will become sensitive to the impact of visual/video worship presentations on a congregation.
3. The student will become familiar with music ministry administration tools.
4. The student will understand the importance of the role of technology in current church settings and future scenarios.
5. The student will be able to differentiate between church website designs that draw people to a church and those that are not culturally sensitive.
6. The student will organize all professor and student information shared in the class into a google drive folder.
7. The student will grow to appreciate the ever-changing nature of working with technology and embrace that portion of technology that can enhance the Christians corporate worship experience.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

- a) Students will be required to utilize **Blackboard** (BB) on the NOBTS website for the course syllabus, documents, grading, and announcements.
- b) Students will receive weekly reading/video/resource assignments through BB. These assignments in a given week may include research inquiries (e.g., the Journal of Research in Music Education), video recordings through Bluejeans, and/or resources such as those included in this syllabus. The students will be required to discuss these reading assignments and/or resources through BB discussion. The student will be required to make one post per week and respond to two other posts.
- c) Students will produce two of the three following digital music assignments: a lead sheet, a hymn sheet, or an audio/MIDI project. The student will use a music notation application for a lead sheet or hymn sheet and an audio/MIDI application for an audio/MIDI project:

- d) The student will complete one topical **full-text** (any word spoken or sung by the congregation) **worship guide with accompanying PPT, ProPresenter, or projection software** project to be presented in the February workshop. Worship topics must match a particular biblical passage and should be submitted to the professor for approval. A digital version of a printed guide of the order of worship should be provided as well. This “printed guide” will be shared with the professor and class through google drive.

- e) Each student will prepare a **major topic presentation** for session 3--see dates below. **This assignment is an embedded assignment that will be completed by all students for all the sections of this course. The rubric for assessing this assignment can be found below. Please complete the assignment according to the syllabus. The rubric below will be used for academic jury assessment. A rubric for the student's grade for this assignment may be found in Blackboard; the rubric for the student's grade in Blackboard highlights the elements in the rubric below.** Assignments for presentations will be made in meeting one. A list will be posted on Google Docs, and a link provided, for topic selection. Students will post a link to their presentation in BB for classmates to download for future reference. The student will create a 1200 word **major topic** paper, using at least 2 sources. The student is expected to use the *NOBTS Manual of Style and Form*: <https://www.nobts.edu/resources/pdf/writing/StyleGuide.pdf>. A grading rubric will be provided in BB for the paper. The student will make a 15 - 20 minute presentation on the topic providing visuals with handouts for students, PPT, and/or internet projection. Key resources should be noted in the endnote portion of the handouts or presentation. Additional internet resources may be presented in the oral reports that are not a primary part of the paper. A grading rubric will be provided in BB for the oral report. **The paper associated with this project is the embedded assignment and requires a full title page.**

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- f) **In The Trenches** - The student will make arrangements for 2 on-site visit/interviews to a “reasonably” local church using “relatively” up-to-date technology. This assignment will be presented during the 4th workshop. Worship leaders from these two churches are to be interviewed in person with church music technology in mind. One is to be a Southern Baptist, and one could be from another denomination. The report, combining these two interviews, is to be 10 minutes in length with good analysis, summary, and take-away sections. Creativity, accuracy, thoroughness, participation, and applicability to music/worship ministry will heavily influence the student’s grade.

- h) **Reflection paper** - The student will complete a *1500 word* reflection paper. This paper is to be a synthesis or take-away paper from the course as a whole. Papers are to be typed and double-spaced, using Times New Roman 12-point font, with at least 5 footnotes, bibliography, and a title page. A grading rubric will be provided in BB.
