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This course begins on January 17, 2023, and, by that date, students should have access to the Canvas shell, where they will find information and instructions about the course. # **Purpose of the Course**

The purpose of this class is to help students develop the knowledge and skills necessary to lead plateaued and declining churches in a variety of settings to become revitalized. This course provides the conceptual tools necessary to understand and work effectively in revitalizing churches by using a case study approach.

# **Student Learning Outcomes**

In order to serve churches effectively through team ministry, the students should:

- · Be able to apply their knowledge and comprehension of key issues germane to effective church revitalization.
- · Value leadership skills necessary for effective church revitalization.

· Be able to identify possible causes of plateau and decline of a local church in order to develop a strategy for revitalization of the selected local church.

# **Course Methodology**

In coordination with lectures, videos, reading assignments, and in-class discussions, revitalization principles for leaders will be addressed, discussed, and analyzed. Principles representing small, medium, and large churches; churches in rural, small towns, medium-sized cities, and metropolitan areas that have not baptized anyone in years. Students will enhance their skills in leading church revitalization through three closely related ways:

- 1. Analyzing and developing solutions to different problems churches confront that hinder the revitalization process.
- 2. Constructing "principles for church revitalization" through biblical standards and research of revitalized churches in a variety of contexts.
- 3. Developing conceptual tools and frameworks that help make sense of how to revitalize churches.

### Course Requirements

# 1. Reading Quizzes: See syllabus for dates

Based on course readings, students can expect five (5) reading quizzes throughout the semester. Each reading quiz contains ten (10) multiple-choice, fill-in-the-blank, or true-and-false questions. Quizzes expire Forty (40) minutes from start time but are open-book.

# 2. Biblical Basis Report Due Feb. 2 @ 11:59pm

The student will present a 3 to 5 double-spaced page paper establishing a biblical foundation for church revitalization. Utilizing both the Old and New Testaments, the student will also include one biblical character to exemplify church revitalization.

**3. Demographic's Report Due Jan 24th @ 11:59pm (Due to Canvas challenges- due Jan 26th)** The student will present a 2 to 5 double-spaced page paper analyzing the demographics of the church

attending. The student will emphasize unique characteristics, opportunities for growth, and revitalization challenges. Demographic information can be obtained by filling out demographic information at www.namb.net.

# 4. Church Health Report March 23rd @ 11:59pm

The student will present a 3 to 5 double-spaced page paper analyzing the church's health. The student will rate and explain the following categories on a scale of one (1) to ten (10): Leadership, Evangelism, Discipleship, Ministry cohesion, fellowship, and friendliness. An explanation of the score rating and ways for category improvement should accompany each entry.

# 5. Revitalization Report April 20th @ 11:59pm

The student will present a 4 to 6 double-spaced page paper establishing steps for church revitalization. The student must establish an introduction for revitalization, a plan for revitalization, support needed for revitalization, challenges to revitalization, and best method for revitalization. More details forthcoming.

# 6. Book Reviews Book #1 Due Feb. 16 @ 11:59pm | Book #2 Due April 6th @ 11:59pm

Each student will read and review *There's Hope For Your Church: First Steps to Restoring Health and Growth* and *Tempered Resilience*. Each review must include:

- a. a synopsis of major themes of the book,
- b. a critical analysis of strengths and limitations of the book,
- c. and several principles (3-5) the student can derive for church revitalization.
- d. Each review is to be 4-6 pages, double-spaced, employing Turabian.

# 7. Midterm Exam Opens Mar. 7 - Closes - Mar. 9th @ 11:59pm

A final exam will reflect all readings, PowerPoint, and in-class material covered **midway** throughout the semester. Details about the exam will be discussed as the date nears.
