THE RESURRECTION

Amid the heyday of Christian enthusiasm, as we march toward the goal of better organizations, finer buildings, bigger salaries, greater number, and vaster publicity; is it not true that we are giving too little space in our programs, too little time in our planning, and too small a sphere in our thoughts, to that great dynamic that has been the motive power of true Christianity down through the two milleniums of its existence, the RESURRECTION? Is it because we have lived among throngs of those who have desecrated this great occasion by engrossing into and around it the practices of paganism and mythology? Perhaps to some extent but not altogether.

Shall we or can we as Christians, give to the Resurrection its proper place in our lives and to the world, by withdrawing ourselves from those who have desecrated it, or should we not give to it its proper place even as we live among them?

PROF. E. O. SELLERS



Professor E. O. Sellers known to us as "Uncle Fuller" was born in Michigan. He finished the Lansing High School at the age of sixteen, and soon thereafter was apprenticed a surveyor and civil engineer, and at the age of twenty-one was elected City Engineer and Superintendent of Public Works of Lansing. He held this position for six years.

He studied music at Moody Bible Institute, and in 1908 became a member of the faculty of that school, assistant to the late Dr. D. B. Townner and also having charge of the night classes. He occupied this position for twelve years. While he was teacher here he was associated in evangelistic meetings, with such men as Dr. Torrey, Gipsey Smith, Dr. J. Wilbur Chapman and Dr. A. C. Dixon.

As an organizer of and worker with men Prof. Sellers has had a great deal of experience. Having been closely associated with the Y. M. C. A. for many years, also with the Men's Brotherhood, and several times teacher of Men's Bible Classes. At present he is an active member of the business men's organizations in New Orleans.

Prof. Sellers has also travelled extensively. He travelled in Canada as a Y. M. C. A. speaker and singer; twice during the World's War he went to Europe; and since coming to B. B. I. he has travelled in the Holy Land and through South America.

"Uncle Fuller" came to B. B. I. as teacher in 1919. During his first two years he taught Personal Evangelism and was director of the Practical Activities, in addition to teaching music. He has served faithfully as head of the music department for thirteen years.

Due to the reducing of the number of the faculty by the trustees, "Uncle Fuller" was one of the number that was removed. However, he will remain connected with the Institute, in charge of correspondence department and extensive work. There is a great

field as well as a great need for this new work upon which he is entering. He shall perhaps do an even greater work with this new field than he has done in the past.
