All proposals should include a title, a 200-word description, and a brief statement concerning your credentials (education and experience). Proposals are due by January 31, 2023.

## **SW ETS/EPS Ben Arbour Memorial Student Paper Competition**

Student members whose papers are accepted for inclusion in the program will be eligible to enter a student paper competition. Students who wish to enter the competition must submit the following to Greg Trickett at [gtrickett@wc.edu](mailto:gtrickett@wc.edu) by February 26, 2023:

1. A titled, full version of the paper to be presented (no more than 5,000 words) suitable for blind review.
2. A 200-300 word abstract with the paper title as it appears on the blind review submission, the student's name, pursued degree, and societal (EPS or ETS) and institutional affiliations. Winner(s) will be announced at the final plenary session of the conference. Students must present their papers at the conference to be considered for the competition.
