
















# CHART 3: Participants by Racial/Ethnic Identity








### **CHART 4: Age Range and Gender**















### CHART 6: Number of Dependents by Gender and Marital Status









#### CHART 7B: Educational Debt Incurred at Seminary for All Students




























# CHART 18: Importance of Field Education/Internship if Required












