

## Accelerated Master of Divinity

## Eligibility

- Earned at least a "B" in the undergraduate courses applied toward the Accelerated MDiv.
- No more than five years after baccalaureate graduation
- Courses are evaluated on a course-by-course basis to ensure sufficient equivalency with NOBTS courses
- A research paper must be submitted indicating ability in research and writing

The chart below indicates the NOBTS courses for which undergraduate study may be applied toward the Accelerated MDiv Program. Students may qualify to receive up to 27 hours toward their MDiv through the Accelerated MDiv.
