### *Accelerated Master of Divinity*

#### **Eligibility**

- Earned at least a “B” in the undergraduate courses applied toward the Accelerated MDiv.
- No more than five years after baccalaureate graduation
- Courses are evaluated on a course-by-course basis to ensure sufficient equivalency with NOBTS courses
- A research paper must be submitted indicating ability in research and writing

The chart below indicates the NOBTS courses for which undergraduate study may be applied toward the Accelerated MDiv Program. No more than 25% of the total hours required for the degree may be applied toward the Accelerated MDiv.

In addition, students may qualify for advanced placement in biblical languages. For every six hours of undergraduate credit in Greek/Hebrew, students may proceed into the next logical level.
