When Ron felt God's call on his life, he began working in a church and was ordained at 19 years old. After a few years, he realized that he needed more theological education.

"By the time I was 24, I had preached all of the sermons that I could borrow and felt that it was time to go to seminary," he said." I asked my father-in-law, who was a pastor, which seminary was the most evangelistic, and he said, New Orleans. So, my wife Fran and fivemonth-old twins moved to NOBTS in May of 1974."

The McCaskill's felt God's presence on campus, but they also saw Him in the lives of caring faculty and staff. Their experience created a lifelong bond with the school.

After he graduated, Ron spent several years serving with state and national chapters of the seminary's Alumni Association. As president of the National Alumni Association for NOBTS in 2005, he worked closely with NOBTS and Leavell College leaders to get the school back on its feet in the wake of Hurricane Katrina. "Seminary taught me that I had one singular focus as a child of God: to bring His lost children back to Him," he explains. "During my first weeks on campus, I came across Matthew 28:18-20 installed in the tile floor on the old administration building (now Bunyan classroom building). I stood in its circle and prayed that God would use me to bring this command into my life and to let it be my life's priority.



Donor-Advised Funds

Not new but possibly new to you is a charitable giving vehicle called donor-advised funds. Generally, a donor-advised fund (DAF) is a separately identified fund or account that is maintained and operated by a section 501(c)(3) organization, which is called a sponsoring organization. You may recognize Fidelity Charitable, Schwab Charitable, or even the National Christian Foundation, as a few DAF sponsoring organizations.

The sponsoring organization has legal control over your contributions. However, you retain advisory privileges with respect to the distribution of funds and the investment of assets in the account.

NOBTS can receive your DAF contributions. Specifically, you may send your Foundation Board endowment contribution or a gift to the Providence Fund. Your gifts are welcomed and help students in great ways.

A word of caution: DAF contributions may not directly cover the tuition or fees of a named student. The reason for this is that the IRS does not allow individuals to benefit from DAF contributions. Therefore, NOBTS cannot process the gift to directly benefit a student's account.

I hope this helps you in your knowledge of DAFs and how you can use them here. This is not an exhaustive explanation, and we welcome your questions anytime.

As always, please consult your investment and tax professional to see how you may leverage a DAF to benefit Kingdom work.
