REPRESENTATIVE COURSES TAUGHT

- *Introduction to Biblical Hermeneutics*—master’s level course designed as a team-taught, interdisciplinary effort with an Old Testament professor surveying the history and theory of Biblical interpretation from which a hermeneutical model is developed, with emphasis upon the genres of Biblical literature.

- *Intermediate Greek Grammar*—master’s level course providing the intermediate stage of a language-track program consolidating the results of the introductory grammar, but moving more into syntactical and idiomatic nuances of the language, with emphasis on vocabulary acquisition and translation facility.
- *New Testament Exegesis: The Sermon on the Mount*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both redactional and narrative critical approaches for an overview of the definitive summary of the teaching of Jesus.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Gospel of Mark*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both redactional and traditional historical-critical approaches for an investigation into the Synoptic problem, as well as the sociological context for Mark's discipleship theme.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Acts*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both literary and narrative critical approaches for a concise presentation of a new vision of the people of God.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Romans*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both literary and rhetorical methodologies for a fresh approach to a Christian classic with emphasis on unpacking the rhetorical significance of the Israel of God in the thought of Paul.
- *New Testament Exegesis: 1 and 2 Corinthians*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both literary, sociological, and traditional historical-critical methodologies for an investigation into the worship and praxis of Pauline churches with implications for Pauline missionary strategy in urban settings.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Galatians*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both rhetorical and traditional historical-critical methodologies for an investigation into the new perspective on Paul regarding the Law and historical issues associated with the text of Acts.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Ephesians*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both literary and rhetorical methodologies for an evaluation of developments in Pauline communities toward a universal ecclesiology and the Pauline legacy.

rhetorical methodologies for an evaluation of eschatological thought of Paul and the sociology of early Pauline communities.

- *New Testament Exegesis: James*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and historical-critical methodology for an exploration into the possible history of the James community as an alternate trajectory in early Christian thought and life with implications for the loss of Jewish Christianity’s voice in the move to gentile dominance in the church.
- *New Testament Exegesis: 1 Peter*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both literary and rhetorical methodologies for an evaluation of the Petrine trajectory within Christianity and the implications of persecution for that trajectory.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Epistles of John*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and traditional historical-critical methodology for an exploration into the possible history of the Johannine community as an alternate trajectory in early Christian thought and life with implications for emerging early Catholicism of the second century responding to gnostic heresy.
- *New Testament Exegesis: Revelation*—master’s level course offered in both English and Greek, using critical commentaries and both literary, narrative, and rhetorical critical approaches, surveying the history of interpretation as well as investigating contributions from the social sciences to an understanding of the sociological context of apocalyptic genre.
- *Doctoral Seminars*—expertise in the critical study of Acts, Romans, and Revelation interacting with critical commentaries, monographs, specialized studies, journal articles, language and linguistic studies, with a robust scholarly bibliography, with emphasis upon historical exegesis and the literary use of modern critical methodologies, but most especially rhetorical.
