Executive Summary:

The Biblical Ministry Certificate is offered in two deliveries (OLC and PI) which are on distinct course rotations. Almost all courses have been offered once with similar scores across the deliveries.

In this assessment, benchmarks were set for almost all direct measures. Overall, we will begin to compare student achievement moving forward, but because of the schedule rotations there will be a two-year gap before new data is available on certain courses. Our benchmarks will unify style for measures utilizing selected items from exams. Therefore, our action step for the next assessment iteration will be to supply data and request our grid to provide data disaggregated by section, including composite mean and percentage of students scoring above the benchmark.
