Third, two courses taught at
prison extensions do not utilize

were not requested in a timely
fashion by the Program
Coordinator. As a result, the
papers were not available at

Executive Summary

In 2022, the Biblical Studies Rubric was updated. After working through the first year of papers using the rubric several items need to be addressed by Leavell College faculty. First, the Leavell College faculty need to standardize the research paper requirement for all 4000-level Biblical Studies courses. Second, , the Program Coordinator requests that the faculty of Leavell College revisit the Biblical Studies rubric. Several papers assessed from the Spring 2023 and Fall 2023 semesters received low scores in the areas of "Modern Application" and "Spiritual/Transformational Component." The rationale for those low scores is directly related to the topic of the research paper. In general, exegetical papers written in the 4000-level Biblical Studies courses align more consistently with the Leavell College Biblical Studies Rubric; however, research papers written on specific topics do not lend themselves to include sections/content that address "Modern Application" and the "Spiritual/Transformational Component." The suggested action plan is that "Modern Application" and "Spiritual/Transformational Component" be specified in the Research Paper assignment instructions and research process video.
