At present, we have small enrollment numbers in this certificate (4 for the fall semester 2022). Such small numbers provide skewed data, which is why we have kept the benchmark for SLO 2 as is. Additionally, the courses in the current iteration of the certificate are not all required courses in the AA and BA, so they are not often taught. Our curriculum is changing in Fall 2023; the courses and their applicable assessment artifacts listed under SLO 1 will be updated once the certificate has been updated to reflect the new curriculum. That new assessment plan will be affirmed by the Assessment Oversight Committee in late spring or summer of 2023.
