Note of explanation: The data from THSE6300 Theological Research and Writing Seminar is missing for 2021 and 2022. Multiple factors contributed to this loss of data. First, there was a change in technology management from BlackBoard to Canvas. Data from previous semesters was to be archived, but when the course shell was searched in June 2023 for data from previous semesters, there was no data (student assignments) to retrieve from 2021 or 2022. Second, a change in administrative responsibilities at the division level in June 2022 resulted in data not being collected at that time from the previous academic year. This potential gap will be addressed in the future with assistance from the IE office to coordinate with divisional associate deans to ensure collection of all required data at the end of the Fall and Spring semesters. Also, **New Benchmarks** were not provided in column 5 because new measures were approved to begin Fall 2023.
