Recommendations by the Jury:

Much has changed with curriculum and course evaluations since this jury was last conducted. As a result, data was difficult to gather and insufficient for accurate assessment of the degree.

The current jury (consisting of Drs. Rice, Newsom, Williams, and Nix) recommend significant changes to the assessment rubric moving forward to better assist in accurately assessing the MAPM.

For Student Learning Outcome 1, all of the current direct measures will be erased and replaced with an assessment of the "Theology of Pastoral Ministry" assignment in the Pastoral Ministry course. This will be the only direct measure for SLO1.

We will maintain the current indirect measures from the Degree Program Surveys.

For Student Learning Outcome 2, all of the current direct measures will be erased and replaced with an assessment of the "Church Revitalization Strategy" assignment in the Church Revitalization course (required for all MAPM students). This will be the only direct measure for SLO2.

We will erase the current indirect measures, and assess question #6 of the course evaluations for the Pastoral Ministry and Church Revitalization courses.

For Student Learning Outcome 3, the current direct measure will be erased and replaced with an assessment of the "Personal Discipleship Map" assignment in the Discipleship and Spiritual Formation course. This will be the only direct measure for SLO3.

The current indirect measures will be replaced by an assessment of question 17 B and 17 G on the ATS Graduating Student Questionnaire.
