- A strong focus on the assessment process has improved the accuracy of the data collected.
- LC now has better rubrics which accurately assess the program SLOs.
- LC faculty recently revised ETS proficiency profile exam questions which more accurately assess material taught in required classes.
- LC is using assignments and rubrics which can effectively assess direct measures over time.
 - 2. If not obvious from the rubric or other juries, please note specific **weaknesses to be improved** in the degree program as a whole (and/or curriculum) found by the jury related to SLOs.
- LC lacks semesters of data and graduates to clarify informed benchmarks.
- LC administrators must confirm that embedded assignments and rubrics are consistently applied in required classes.
- This jury lacked data from 2 class sections where the adjunct instructor did not submit graded assignments.
- LC must continue to improve monitoring and teaming with adjunct instructors to secure data.
- LC must address the lack of data from the "mandatory" proficiency profile exam.
- 3. Please note any **recommended or proposed curricular improvements** needed related to SLOs.
- LC should explore pre- and post-test options for proficiency profile exam (gathering change per individual student).
- LC should consider more standardized rubrics (see below).
- Should LC adopt a "critical thinking" SLO?
 - 4. Please note any **recommendations or improvements for the process.** (Revision of rubric, reconsideration of SLOs, reconsideration of artifact used, etc.)
- Clarify criteria for students submitting indirect measures and push more graduates to take the ETS proficiency profile exam so that we receive more data.
- Communicate expectations (grading and collection) with instructors of all sections.
- Consider developing a universal rubric for writing assignments across all SLOs.
- Consider exploring other forms of assessment instead of juries: instructor assessed assignments, tests.
- Our total assessment and jury process is improving.
